A SCHOOL in West Berkshire recently relocated to increase the space and learning facili-

ies for its pupils.

Montessori school Harriet House, which was based in Ashampstead, has moved to The Walled Garden, Yattendon, to orrovide increased space for the bupils and an opportunity to extend

Most of the school has already noved, and the reception class vill open in September 2013.
