Policy on Equal Opportunities

At Harriet House children are treated equally regardless of race, religion, ability, or gender. We aim to ensure that all children and families feel included, safe and valued.

- All children have an equal right to be listened to and valued in the setting.
- Children are encouraged to recognise their own unique qualities and the characteristics they share with other children.
- All staff ensures that the needs of every child are fully met especially when the key person needs to spend more time with a child who is new to the setting or to a child whose behaviour is giving rise for concern.
